Make sure to keep them properly filled and inspect the treads on a regular basis. To avoid unbalanced wear, make sure to have them rotated at least every


5.000 miles.

- Inspect belts regularly.

 The belt system in your car helps things such as your alternator and air conditioning compressor operate correctly. When these break, they can cause costly damage. To avoid this, inspect them regularly for wear. If they are showing signs, go ahead and replace them before they become a problem.
- Inspect fluids regularly.

 Keep up with oil, water, power steering fluid and other important liquids in your car. Check them regularly and have them topped off or replaced as needed.
- Go in for routine maintenance.

 Make sure to go in for regular oil changes and stay on top of your car's recommended maintenance schedule (found in your owner's manual).



MAKE IT A HABIT to check fluids often

- Protect your electrical system.

 Anytime you plan on performing work on your car that involves the electrical system, protect your investment by disconnecting the battery.
- 6 Protect your paint job.
 Keep up with basic outside maintenance, such as washing and waxing the paint. This can prevent rusting and help keep scratches down to a minimum.
- Pay attention to warning lights.

 Do not ignore dashboard warning lights if they come on. Take your vehicle in to find out the source of the problem.
- 8 Inspect exterior lights frequently.
 Take time to check signaling, brake lights and headlights on a regular basis. Be sure to inspect these at least once or twice a month.
- 9 Change your filters when necessary.
 Keep up with filter changes to avoid system clogs.
